**A LIFE MADE POSSIBLE BY ROTARY**

Andrea Naranjo was the daughter of a Rotarian in Quito, Ecuador, so she was familiar with the concept of Rotary from an early age. The family had hosted exchange students in their home and Andrea was able to see the impact of international interaction first hand. Her brother and sister both became Rotary exchange students and loved the experience. Andrea enjoyed sharing information about her country and learning about other places. Rotary exposed her to the world!

In 1999, Andrea was selected to be a Rotary exchange student – and was sponsored by our club. She attended Hilton Head High School and lived with host parents, John and Carol Howe. Her year on Hilton Head was a life-changing experience for her.

After graduating from High School, Andrea decided to attend college in the U.S. Since her sister was living and working in Charlotte, Andrea applied to and was accepted at University of North Carolina to study chemical engineering. Unfortunately, by 2000, the Ecuador economy was on the verge of collapse and her father experienced financial problems and could not afford to send Andrea to UNC. Andrea was disappointed but was prepared to pursue her degree in Ecuador.

To the rescue came Jan and Ernie Dyer, friends of the Howe's, who had met and been impressed by Andrea during her time on Hilton Head. The Dyers became sponsors of Andrea and put her

through 5 years of undergraduate education. What a remarkable gift!

Andrea graduated in 2005 and took a full time position with Proctor and Gamble doing product development on Crest toothpaste. In 2006, Andrea became an American citizen. In 2007, she left P & G for graduate school to study Chemical Engineering doing cell research at the University of Delaware. She has won many prestigious awards and scholarships in graduate school.

Andrea has been accepted to a course on neutrons in structural biology at the Oak Ridge National Lab for 2010. Upon graduation, she will go into either academia or a research lab – she truly enjoys both researching and teaching.

Andrea is so grateful for all of the opportunities that have been opened to her through Rotary – she tearfully expressed hopes that some day she will impact other lives the way Rotarians have impacted hers.
